We are on track to meet FY15 benchmarks for # of families served, home visit completion, and outcome achievement rates. In FY15, due to changes in program leadership, increased reporting requirements which requires data entry in 3 separate databases, and more time devoted to professional development and interactions with community partners, the MCH nurse dedicated more time to coordinating service than in years past. This has impacted the number of visits she is able to conduct as a part-time employee.

This is a permanent change in our program model, and highlights our commitment to on-going quality improvement, whereby our program is evaluated by the quality of our services, and not just the quantity of visits.

We have spent much of our RN's time recently reconciling our REDCap data for quarters 1 and 2. Our in-house databases do not pull numbers in the way REDCap is asking for them to be reported (i.e. families members are shown as individual, not as a unit), therefore much of the work must be accomplished by using paper and a calculator which takes an extraordinary amount of staff time away from work with families. This has resulted in 25% more coordination time and 41% more time spent in charting that in the previous fiscal year. In addition, it is unclear to us as to why sometimes the REDCap numbers do not match our program numbers in some categories. We continue to struggle with the number of databases required to address REDCap data, which is not our most important data and which does not best describe our program outcomes or the quality of our services and the impact on families and communities.
