On Dec. 28th a meeting was held with the United Way of Central Iowa(UWCI). At this meeting we obtained permission to use UWCI allocated funds with increased flexibilty to assist our work in central iowa to include Dallas, and Warren Counties. We were also encouraged to ask for an increase in overall funding from UWCI during the funding cycle for FY 19. Increased funding is not guranteed, however we will make every effort to make this happen. At the end of Nov. a meeting was held with Dallas County Public Health to review our MOU and discuss shawdowed visit(s) progress/process. Within the MOU it indicates that families are to be scheduling HV with the New Parent Program at time of shawdowed visit, if family is intrested. To date this has not been occuring on a consisent basis, due to families being informed by DCPH that offical "referral" would happen closer to delivery or up to two months after delivery of child. YTD 6 Shawdowed visits have been acheived with DCPH, three were eligible for the New Parent Program, all of which have since been enrolled into our services. 2/3 families deemed uneligible due to being already enrolled in PAT services, the third was non-english speaking. The New Parent Program recognizes the need to address the non-English-speaking population(s) that reside in Dallas and surrounding counties within family support services. Due to this the New Parent Program is making program adjustments to better meet this need.

Dallas County Public Health is working to cultivate a referral relationship with the new WIC contractor (Broadlawns). In the past, we received a list of prenatal moms who were on WIC - since the contractor change in October, we have not yet reached an agreement to receive this list. This has resulted in significantly fewer incoming referrals from WIC. To address this challenge, DCPH convened a meeting with WIC staff and VNS staff to discuss opportunities for collaboration. As an outcome of this meeting, WIC invited our MCH staff to have a physical presence to recruit families at all Dallas County WIC clinics, but since WIC participants do not need to physically be at WIC clinic to receive benefits (they can do nutrition education online, for instance), the volume of clients attending clinic is low. MCH staff are meeting with Broadlawns again in Quarter 3 to discuss avenues for collaboration, especially related to the WIC list and we hope to reach an agreement that will boost the number of incoming referrals from WIC. DCPH has also implemented a social determinants of health screening tool at immunization clinics (which also asks about pregnancy) - clients with unmet needs are referred to Health Navigation and/or the MCH program (as appropriate). As an added challenge to meeting our benchmarks, we are spending more time coordinating joint visits with LSI which takes away from time that can be spent doing outreach to recruit new families into the program.

While we are required (per lowa Family Support Credential and ECI contract) to refer all families to long-term support programs, we are unable to connect 100% of our clients with these programs due to a waiting list at PAT and LSI's inability to serve non-English speaking clients. Nearly 50% of our clients are non-English speakers (primarily Spanish, Arabic, Burmese, and Tigrigna). This leaves a significant gap in services for Immigrant and Refugee families who could most benefit from long-term family support programming. Thus, joint visits will not solve the low up-take rate for families that we refer to long-term support programs, as half of the clients we serve and refer on to long-term programs are not able to be served due to their language.
