We use two tracking systems for the PAT Program - Visit Tracker and DAISEY. Each system counts children in the program differently. DAISEY does not count prenatal children and it counts all children of active families ages birth - 5, even if the child has exited but the family is still participating. Visit Tracker includes prenatal children in the service count and only those children who are active. The more reliable count of children served is the one in Visit Tracker, therefore we use that number in reporting. There will be a discrepency between what we report and what is on the DAISEY report. We have a waiting list of one family only, and this is a special circumstance. This family needs an interpreter, and our Parent Educator who works with the needed interpreter is currently full. We anticipate that this Educator may have an opening within the next quarter. However, the number of visits to families requiring interpretation is close to exceeding the projected amount for the entire year. We anticipate a budget adjustment or a request for additional funding for interpretation if we are to continue providing services to families requiring the use of interpreters. The on-boarding process for our newest Parent Educator is moving smoothly along. She has completed all required PAT trainings and will be trained on the LSP in October . She successfully transferred the families wishing to remain in the program being served by the retired Educator and has added new families. We partnered with the Winterset Library to offer a successful Roll and Read Event in September. We are, once again, partnering with the Waukee Public Library to host a BlockFest event in early 2019. Partnerships with libraries and child development centers throughout our serve area are proving to be successful collaborations for events such as Roll and Read and BlockFest.
