Success 4 Kids Council Purpose:

The Success 4 Kids Council was created May 2001 for the primary purpose to undertake activities in furtherance of prevention of child abuse. The Success 4 Kids Council is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit corporation under the Iowa Nonprofit Corporation Act, Chapter 504A, Code of Iowa. The mission of the Success 4 Kids Council is "To prevent child abuse in Adair County."

Early Childhood Committee Purpose:

The Adair County Early Childhood Committee shall be the standing advisory committee for the 4 R Kids Early Childhood Iowa Area Board. Community partners, agencies, citizens and Board members may participate; participation is not limited to any agency or person. The 4 R Kids Early Childhood Iowa Area Board may refer specific issues/tasks to this committee. Tasks may include but not limited to, provide expertise in fields of health, human services, early care and education; suggest public policy; provide guidance on community needs and issues; and advocate for the early childhood Iowa area.

Collaboration:

The Adair County Early Childhood Committee is combining efforts with the Success 4 Kids Council. This will reach a wider network of stakeholders that will increase community collaboration among many agencies. There will be a focus on early childhood as well as other age groups.



Adair County Early Childhood Resources

- □ **Buckle up Right** A Certified Car Seat Technician will show you how to correctly install your child's safety seat, make sure your current seat is not recalled, expired and appropriate for height/weight. - □ Childcare Nurse Consultant The purpose of this program is to promote best practice by providing guidance and technical assistance to child care and preschool providers, regarding the health and safety of the children in their care, this is accomplished via onsite visits; group trainings; and, telephone and mailing communications. - □ Childcare Resource and Referral Resources, education, and advocacy for affordable, accessible, quality childcare including: assists parents in locating quality childcare & provides child care providers with educational resources, support, and consultation. - □ **Dental Screenings** The I-SmileTM Program provides care coordination and support to families with young children who need dental care. The I-SmileTM team can assist with setting up appointments, provide preventive services such as dental screenings and fluoride treatments, and teach children and parents how to keep a healthy mouth. - □ **Early Access and AEA** Early ACCESS is a partnership between service providers and families with young children ages birth to age three. The purpose of this program is for families and staff to work together in identifying, coordinating, and providing needed services and resources that will help the family assist their infant or toddler to grow and develop. - □ 1st Five Promoting healthy mental development in children 0-5. Referrals received from local medical providers for families with children who may be experiencing a developmental delay, concern, and/or family stress. - □ **Food Program** The food program is part of the federal school lunch program and is available to registered home child care providers. - □ hawk-i A program for uninsured children that provides no-cost or low cost health care coverage to children in working families. For more information contact Matura at 641-202-7114
- □ Health Insurance Market Place Adair County Health System has Certified Application Counselors for the Health Insurance Marketplace. Our Certified Application Counselors can assist you through the application process to obtain health insurance through the Marketplace. - ☐ Immunizations Immunizations for uninsured and underinsured children up to 18 years of age at no charge. Immunizations for adults are available for a fee. Influenza & pneumonia immunizations are available seasonally. For more information contact Adair County Public Health at 641-743-6173.
- □ Lead Testing Children can receive a free lead poisoning test at no cost. For more information contact Matura at 641-202-7114.
- □ **Medicaid** This program gives you health coverage through a Managed Care Organization (MCO) that you get to choose. For more information contact Iowa Department of Human services at 800-338-8366 or http://dhs.iowa.gov/.
- □ Maternal Child Health provides services for women living in Adair County, who are pregnant or have recently given birth. Participants will receive services such as pregnancy and childbirth information, mother and new baby care, breastfeeding support, and community resource and referral. - □ New Parent Program Provides parental awareness of child development and facilitation of family self-sufficiency and stability to access resources for overburdened families in through home visits for pregnant women or new parents and their families. - □ Parents as Teachers This program utilizes the Parents as Teachers curriculum and offers voluntary comprehensive home visitation for parents of children birth to five years of age. For more information contact Southwestern Community College at 641-782-1308.

- □ Quality Child Care Project Provides early care providers with high level trainings and technical assistance to increase quality in early learning environments. - □ Vision Screenings InfantSEE; The American Optometric Association and the Vision Care Institute of Johnson & Johnson Vision Care, Inc. have partnered to create this program, a no cost public health program, to identify the potential for eye and vision problems in infants in their first year of life. Participating optometrists will provide a one-time eye assessment to infants between 6 and 12 months of age, at no cost, regardless of income. - □ WIC Women Infant and Children (WIC) provides extra food to children ages 0-5, pregnant women, and moms. WIC also provides health and nutrition education for families. To participate in the WIC Program, families must be income eligible. For more information contact Matura at 641-202-7114.

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
