The other 3 referrals came from other sources. One from the Perry school system, and the other two were referrals from current clients. One story to share is during a virtual visit with a family the mother showed staff the paper work she had gotten from her child's most recent well child check. Staff noticed that the child was only in the 1% for weight. Staff brought this to the mother's attention and had a discussion about what this information meant. She explained that the child was very small for his age and wanted to make sure the child was eating appropriately for his age. During a virtual visit that took place during a feeding time staff noticed some cues that the child might be hungry and brought the cues to the parents attention. The parents said that they had not noticed these cues before. staff went over with the family the different signs and cues a child may give their parents to let the parents know that the child is hungry. Staff reviewed with the family the appropriate foods the child should be eating for his age and how much. Staff also had a talk with the family about the child attending feeding therapy and made sure that the child is attending his well child check appointments.

Regarding Daisey: Daisey's count of children is not correct, as it counts children ages birth-six. The number in this report is correct, containing prenatal children, and excluding children who have aged out but not yet turned six.

We currently have one family on our waiting list. This family does not speak English. We are in the process of hiring a Parent Educator who speaks this language, and we anticipate that this Parent Educator will be fully trained and capable of serving families within the next

Referrals to our program are down. We've received 21 referrals so far, as compared to 32 we received last program year at this time. We continue to look for innovative ways to reach out directly to families.

Our Group Connections have been very successful this year. We have offered six group connections, and had a total of 160 parents and children in attendance. One of our groups was 'Beyond Bilingual Story Time' where we read a bedtime story in four languages (English, Spanish, Arabic, and Burmese). This group was so popular that we will plan to do it again in the future.

We have enrolled 14 families this program year, with 11 meeting the ECI criteria. This puts us at 78.5%, which is above the required threshold of 75%

A CCNC recieved a phone call from Dallas County Health Department (DCHD) regarding a concern about a child care staff person who had previously tested positive for COVID and was told by the program director she has to come back to work prior to the end of her quarantine. The CCNC became the point person on issue, working collaboratively with the DHS consultant, DCHD staff, program director and child care staff person. The COVID 19 pandemic has impacted many facets of child care and the CCNC is uniquely positioned to guide child care providers to make best practice decisions that support providers and limit spread of COVID 19 infections. In this particular situation, providing education about quarantine parameters and helping child care providers to problem solve on caring for children safely within IDPH and DHS guidelines. The child care staff person continued to isolate through her entire established quarantine period and the child care center was able to stay open to serve children.

Robert Klostermann previously taught for Des Moines Public Schools. His dream is to start a center, but after having consultation with us, decided to first open a Child Development home. After assisting Robert with the application process, he did not have some basic health and safety items. With BIP money he was able to purchase a child-sized table and chairs, a stool to allow children to independently reach the sink to hand wash and shelving to store supplies for easy access for the children. He spent the remaining money on cordless blinds when he learned that best practices that the cords on his blinds could be a danger to children. He has enrolled two children with special needs since receiving the BIP funds. The children were in desperate need of care from someone who knows their unique needs and his care was a perfect fit for the children, and they are thriving. This eases the burden on their family as they were also needing virtual learning assistance, which he is able to provide. He also recognized this family had other needs, so he reached out to us, and we were able to connect him with local resources through our collaboration with community partners. The family is also on CCA, so Bob is still struggling financially, especially since he moved from a teacher's salary to child care. He continues to search for more families but he feels good about being able to help this family.

IECMHC has been responded to enthusiastically by both the directors and staff of the two child care centers served during the past quarter. A variety of issues have been brought up by staff for discussion in the sessions including how one's personal experience with trauma as children and adults impacts one's likelihood of being triggered emotionally by a child's behaviors or emotional struggles. Many of the staff have been able to reflect on their experiences and how these experiences may be impacting their emotional reaction to children who struggle with emotional regulation, have externalizing acting out behaviors, or who are physically aggressive. This type of self-reflection and increased understanding on the part of caretakers is critical to best practices in infant and early childhood care.
