All information has been entered in Daisey. If there is are discrepancies between Daisey and this report, this report's data is the 'most' correct. We can provide clarification as needed.

We have had a waiting list this quarter of two families, due to our inability to hire a Spanish speaking Parent Educator. We have offered each of these families the option of meeting with an English Educator with an interpreter, and both have opted to wait until a Spanish speaking Educator is hired. We are now making good progress on the hiring front, and hope to have someone hired in October or early November.

We continue to see families struggling in a post-pandemic economy and world. Stress levels and tangible needs for our families are at an all-time high. We continue to build relationships with community partners to help families with these needs. We also have measures in place to monitor the stress level of our staff. Our staff are regularly utilizing Joyce Westphal for extra support.

We held our first of three Drive Thru Baby Showers this quarter, and the other two will occur next quarter. These events have been our most successful tool in recruiting prenatal families. Most of these enrollments will happen during our next quarter.

One of the Warren County Parent Educators has been working with a specific family for approximately 15 months. The mother initially planned to give her baby up for adoption but was convinced by the father's family to keep the child. The family was homeless and had already lost one child due to a DHS investigation. Since joining the PAT program. The parent Educator reports that the mom has "blossomed." The mother's attachment to the baby was initially a concern. Based on the Parent Educator's assessment, that attachment has grown over the months and is now secure. The mother has taken initiative to get a job and earns good pay, she also secured an apartment for her family. The mother has also removed herself from an unhealthy relationship with the child's father, which she felt she had been "stuck in" because of the pregnancy. The following is a direct quote from the family's Parent Educator about their progress: "Since moving out of the home she has continued to grow. The last time I met with her, I could tell a weight had been lifted from her shoulder, and she truly looked happy. The kids looked happier and healthier than I had ever seen them. Both children have several health conditions, including asthma, and their dad smoked in the home. I have encouraged the mom to continue to support the relationship between the children and the dad. From my observation, she is doing this and working very hard not to engage in verbal attacks and arguments. There is nothing better than seeing her attachment to her children and seeing and being a part of the life she is building for herself and her children."
