While enrolled in CCNC services, a day care provider notified the nurse consultant with concern of a reoccurring rash on a child which required exclusion due to excessive scratching, leading to breaks in the skin and bleeding. Thus far, the child had been seen by multiple medical providers and now the family was requesting the daycare provider to apply several different creams. On the day of contact to our CCNC program, the provider discussed an additional 3 large circular rashes on the child's back. The daycare provided pictures via email. The nurse consultant discussed the rash appearing to be ringworm. The consultant encouraged the provider to exclude and receive a medical evaluation. The CCNC RN also discussed the importance of a care plan for the child.

The child was examined by the medical provider and was diagnosed with ringworm. The child's guardian states the lesions have been there for months undiagnosed. Now the child is receiving appropriate treatment, and the daycare staff was provided education on ringworm prevention and exposure protocol.
