Successes: We attended the PAT International Conference in San Diego in October, where we were recognized as a Blue Ribbon Affiliate. Four of our staff also presented 2 workshops at the conference, and we have received overwhelmingly positive feedback on the workshops.

We are growing the number of families served in Perry; specifically, families speaking Spanish. Since our Spanish speaking staff is still new, we are staggering out the number of families she can enroll in a month.

Challenge: We have had a waiting list; partly due to the influx of Spanish speaking families and the need to space their enrollments out, and partly due to increased referrals overall in Dallas County. The Health Navigators in Dallas County in particular are a strong referral source for us. We anticipate with the growth of Navigation services in our other two counties, that having a waiting list may be an ongoing challenge for us.
