Since my employment (Jan 2025) only one COS-C class has been completed (10 students). Currently, Joyce is teaching two classes of COS-C to be completed by April 21 and May 1. I have been visiting homes and centers to encourage COS-C training and working with directors to schedule a class. The class that finished this quarter was very encouraged about the course. " As a director, I have the privilege to see all points of view. One big "take away" was adding new verbiage that as 'we team, we can work things out.'" Reflective Consultation focused on a variety of topics, including providing care for children with extensive family trauma such as domestic violence, providing care for children with aggressive behavior toward staff and other children in the center, management of personal stresses, grief, and children with mental health diagnoses and disabilities.

### Other Comments

Currently two sessions of COS-C classes are going. One to end at the end of April and the other the first week of May. Two Food Safety Challenge classes scheduled in April and May. I will reach out to see if there is still need for another CPR course. I have found in-person training hard to fill. I am working with three centers to try to schedule another COS-C class as soon as previous class ends. I am working with the Extension office and have helped to create two embryology kits for preschool programs (incubator, eggs, preschool books, and curriculum) Currently two preschools are hatching chicken. Ten gardening kits were put together (seeds, curriculum, flash cards, trowels) and were given to ten preschool programs to incorporate a school garden. This is in conjunction with the "Farm to School" program that was impleted as part of my additional duties. I have also published and disseminated a monthly newsletter with training dates, farm to school information, and other fun facts for the centers and in-home providers. I continue to reach out to Myra Willms for guidance. Joyce W. and Val C. have been great assets for my first few months in this position.

Throughout the last fiscal year, I've taught 6 CPR classes for child care providers with 36 participants. I'm also behind my goal for the number of providers served. She was able to secure steady employment that she enjoys and would like to advance in. She submitted the new employment information to her landlord 3 times before the rent was corrected. Once they updated her rent amount, she worked on being able to manage this in her budget but was short this first month. She was able to receive assistance with her rent but did not have enough to cover her child care or utility expenses this month. Going forward she feels she has it organized and will be able to maintain her new rent along with her other expenses. She has been referred to LIHEAP for energy assistance and she is also receiving Child Care assistance. \$214 thrive was used to help with daycare. \$88.47 thrive was used to help with utilities this month. \$704 Embrace Iowa/MATURA was used to assist with rent.
